## Title of Lesson: Lord Dunmore's War and the American Revolution in West Virginia Map Activity Grade level: 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Summary: In this activity the students will use a dry-erase map to find the location of the battles and events that took place in West Virginia during Lord Dunmore's War and the American Revolution. WV CCR Social Studies Standards: Label the four major physical geographic regions, major rivers, landforms, natural/man-made SS.8.13 borders, points of interest and bordering states on selected maps. SS.8.14 Identify the 55 counties and major cities of West Virginia on a map and explain the reason for the development of the major cities in their respective locations. SS.8.21 Demonstrate an understanding of the American Revolution, including western Virginia's part in the development of the nation. Compare and contrast the perspectives and roles of different western Virginians during the American Revolution including those of political leaders, soldiers, patriots, Tories/Loyalists, women and Native Americans. Identify the key conflicts, battles and people of the American Revolution in • western Virginia and their effects on the area (e.g., Battle of Point Pleasant, Siege of Fort Henry, Attacks at Fort Randolph and Fort Donnally). Summarize events related to the adoption of Virginia's constitutional conventions, the role of western Virginia and its leaders in the Continental Congress, and the ratification of the U.S. Constitution. Explain the economic and political tensions between the people of western and eastern Virginia including the economic struggles of both groups following the American Revolution and their disagreement over representation. Students will know and understand (content): The location and the importance of the many battles of Lord Dunmore's War and the American Revolution that took place in West Virginia. Students will be able to do (skills): Use different parts of the map to be able to understand location. List and Locate the many battles and events that took place in West Virginia. Materials & Resources: Laminated (Dry-Erase) road map of West Virginia and marker Map activity sheet

## Learning Plan:
