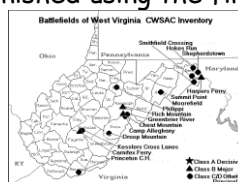


West Virginia in the Civil War Video Project



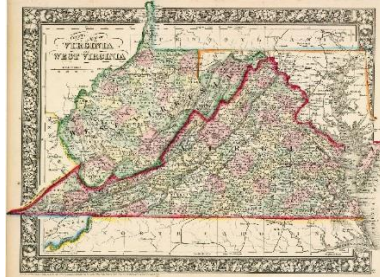
Instructions for My Simple Show West Virginia in the Civil War Video Project:

1. Type the web address <https://www.mysimpleshow.com/> into the search bar of the internet browser.
2. Log into my account to complete the project. Type my email address (_____@k12.wv.us) into first space and my password is _____ into the second space.
3. Once you are logged into the Simple Show website account, click on create a new video.
4. On the next screen, click on create your own script.
5. Make the title of your video: "West Virginia in the Civil War: The Battle of _____"
6. Turn the volume up on your headphones and watch the tutorial video.
7. After watching the video, click the orange "That's It" button.
8. Click on the education tab at the top of the screen.
9. Click on the blank template.
10. Watch the step by step video to review how to build your own video.
11. Start creating your video. Make sure to include your name in the title.
12. In your video chose one of the key battles of the American Civil War that took place in West Virginia that we have studied during this chapter and create a video about the events of the battle. Use your class notes to complete your script for the video. Also use the internet links to the West Virginia Encyclopedia (listed below) to access articles regarding each Civil War battle in West Virginia. 13. The video needs to discuss the following items about the Civil War battle:
 - a. The name of the battle, its location in West Virginia (City & County), & date the battle occurred.
 - b. Identify the key historical figures and principal commanders involved in the battle.
 - c. Detail a brief summary of the events of the battle that occurred. Also identify estimated casualties that occurred during the battle.
 - d. Identify the result of the battle and discuss the historical significance of the battle in West Virginia. Also include a map of the battle.
14. The video needs to be between 1 minute and 30 seconds and should include graphics and a well written script with proper grammar and sentence structure for the video.
15. Publish the video once you are finished using the finalize button.
