RESTROOMS

LOWER LEVEL (LL)

Men's - Near the Down Escalator

Women's - Near the Up Escalator

WATER FOUNTAINS

Located on the Lower Level near each restroom



GIFT SHOP

Located on the Main Level across from the State Archives Reading Room.

Open Tues - Sat
9AM - 4:30PM



EDUCATION CENTER (CLASSROOM)

Located on the Lower Level near the Down Escalator



EDUCATION MEDIA CENTER (SMALL THEATER)

Located on the Lower Level near the Up Escalator and across from the Elevator



PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Personal belongings (and packed lunches!) are stored securely in designated bins assigned at check-in



LUNCH

During fair weather, groups typically dine on the plaza deck of the Culture Center. In the event of inclement weather, groups dine in the Great Hall.

Women's - Behind Guest Services and to the left

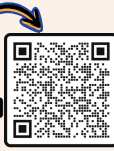
Family Restroom - Behind Guest Services and to the left

DIRECTIONS

From the Interstate, use **Exit 99** (Greenbrier St/State Capitol) onto I-77/I-64.

Entrance to the State Capitol Complex is located at the intersection of Greenbrier Street and Washington Street E at the traffic light. Turn **LEFT** at the guard shack to proceed to visitor parking.

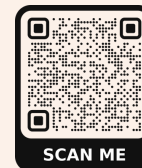
METERED PARKING

Parking is \$0.25 per half hour (max. 4 hours) Mon - Fri, 8AM-5PM.

Our meters accept quarters. Visitors may also pay via PayByPhone, available online or download for free from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store.

Designated metered accessible parking is available. Vehicles must display proper placards or signage in these spaces.

Chaperone Guide

TIPS & TRICKS

Thanks for taking to chaperone! Chaperones are key to a successful field trip. Here are a few tips to help you have a great time!

ABOUT THE FIELD TRIP

The West Virginia State Museum is located within the Culture Center at the State Capitol Complex in Charleston. There's a lot to see and do while you're here! That being said, we suggest:

- Wear comfortable shoes
- Dress in layers. Some parts of our museum can be a bit chilly!

THE ESSENTIALS

- Take a look at our Museum Etiquette. This will help you model behavior for the students in your group. Feel free to review it with your students!
- It's pretty much a no-touch museum, but there are several opportunities for visitors to interact with the material. Look out for touchscreens, play buttons, and artifact drawers designed for deeper exploration.
- In some areas, lighting is kept at a low level to help preserve artifacts.
- You don't have to have all of the answers. There is informational signage throughout the museum. You can always encourage the student to look for the answer, ask follow-up questions, or ask a staff member!
- Once you've reached the simulated coal mine, you're about half way through the museum.
- There's a West Virginia cutout on the floor at the **end** of the museum. This is a good place to gather and make sure you've got everyone.
- There are exhibits on every level of the Culture Center.

MUSEUM ETIQUETTE (OUR DO'S & DON'TS)

Thank you for assistance in making sure that **everyone** visiting the museum has a wonderful time. If you have any questions, please let us know.

DO...

- Enjoy exploring over 6,000 artifacts on display representing the land, people, and culture of our state. Take your time! There's a lot to see.
- Be respectful of others visiting the museum. Talk at a normal or quiet level
- Turn OFF your flash before taking any photos or videos
- Provide adult supervision of all visiting groups and children under the age of 13. We recommend one adult per every 10 students at minimum

PLEASE DO NOT...

- Touch artifacts or scenic elements
 - Artifacts and scenic elements are hands off. Did you know? Our hands produce oils and carry residue that can eventually damage art and artifacts if enough people touch the work.
- Bring food or drink into the museum or exhibit areas.
- Run or engage in rowdy behavior/horseplay.
 - Museum security cameras are placed throughout the museum. Staff are also present to ensure that this expectation is met.
- Use flash photography

CONVERSATION STARTERS

Want some help making conversation? Use one of our sample questions to get the conversation going!

- What do you already know about West Virginia's history?
- What was the first thing you noticed here?
- How do you think people lived differently back then compared to today?
- What's the coolest thing you see?
- Imagine you were living during this time. What would the hardest part be? The most fun part?
- Does this remind you of anything you've learned about before?
- What has been your favorite part so far?
- Why do you think the museum chose to display this?
- If you could add one more thing, what would it be?
- If you could step into one of these exhibits and time-travel, where would you go?
